4100 South to S.R. 201

MAINTENANCE PROJECT



Fact Sheet

Summary

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is working on a Bangerter Highway maintenance project from state Route 201 to 4100 South in West Valley City. Construction crews are grinding the existing concrete to smooth the road and repair existing potholes and cracks. Completing the project now rather than later enables UDOT to avoid more extensive and costly repairs and closures in the future.

Project Scope

Because grinding concrete can be loud, we are employing a timeline that allows construction crews to complete the projects in weeks, rather than months. We ask residents and business owners to understand that construction will be loud at times but that the shortened timeline will mitigate noise impacts and travel delays.

Between now and mid-November, businesses and residents can expect partial closures on Bangerter Highway during daytime and evening hours. Additionally, the schedule allows for full weekend closures during two weeks in late October and early November, but it only permits the closure of one main intersection at a time in an effort to maintain connectivity. The following weekend closures are planned:

- 2700 South to 3100 South (Zone 3): Closed from 10 p.m. Friday, October 29, to 5 a.m. Monday, November 1
- 3100 South to 3500 South (Zone 2): Closed from 10 p.m. Friday, October 29, to 5 a.m. Monday, November 1
- 3500 South to 4100 South (Zone 1): Closed from 10 p.m. Friday, November 5, to 5 a.m. Monday, November 8

Construction within the industrial area from S.R. 201 to 2700 South (Zone 4) will include various partial northbound and southbound closures on Bangerter Highway. These closures will take place during evenings, when residential work is not permitted, and will occur through the duration of the project.

(Construction activities are subject to change due to situations such as inclement weather, equipment issues, construction delays and emergencies.)

What Should Residents and Local Businesses Expect?

- Maintenance will be loud and crews will work at night, so the noise may impact residents and businesses. The contractor is using an aggressive timeline to avoid long-term inconveniences.
- Motorists should anticipate delays, plan ahead and adjust travel schedules where possible.
- Cross streets will be impacted during construction.
- North/South alternate routes include Redwood Road, Interstate 215 and 5600 West
