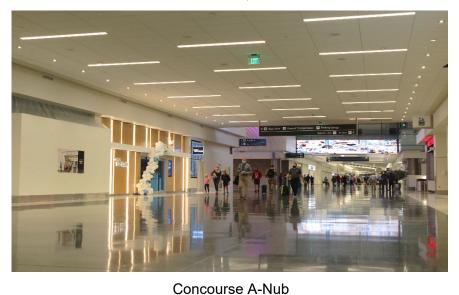

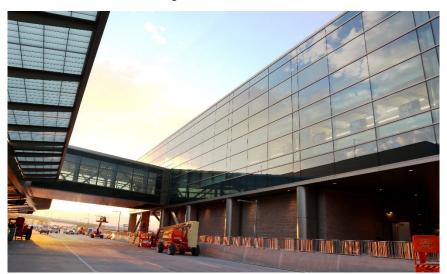

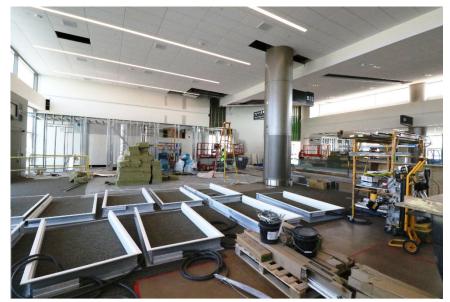

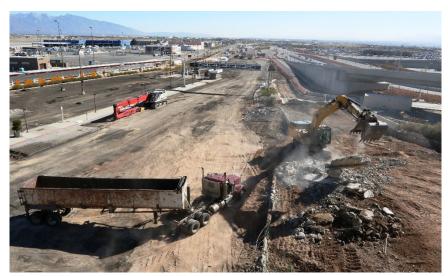

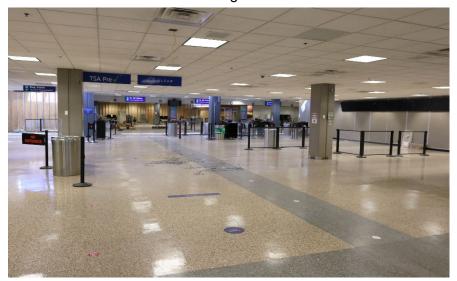

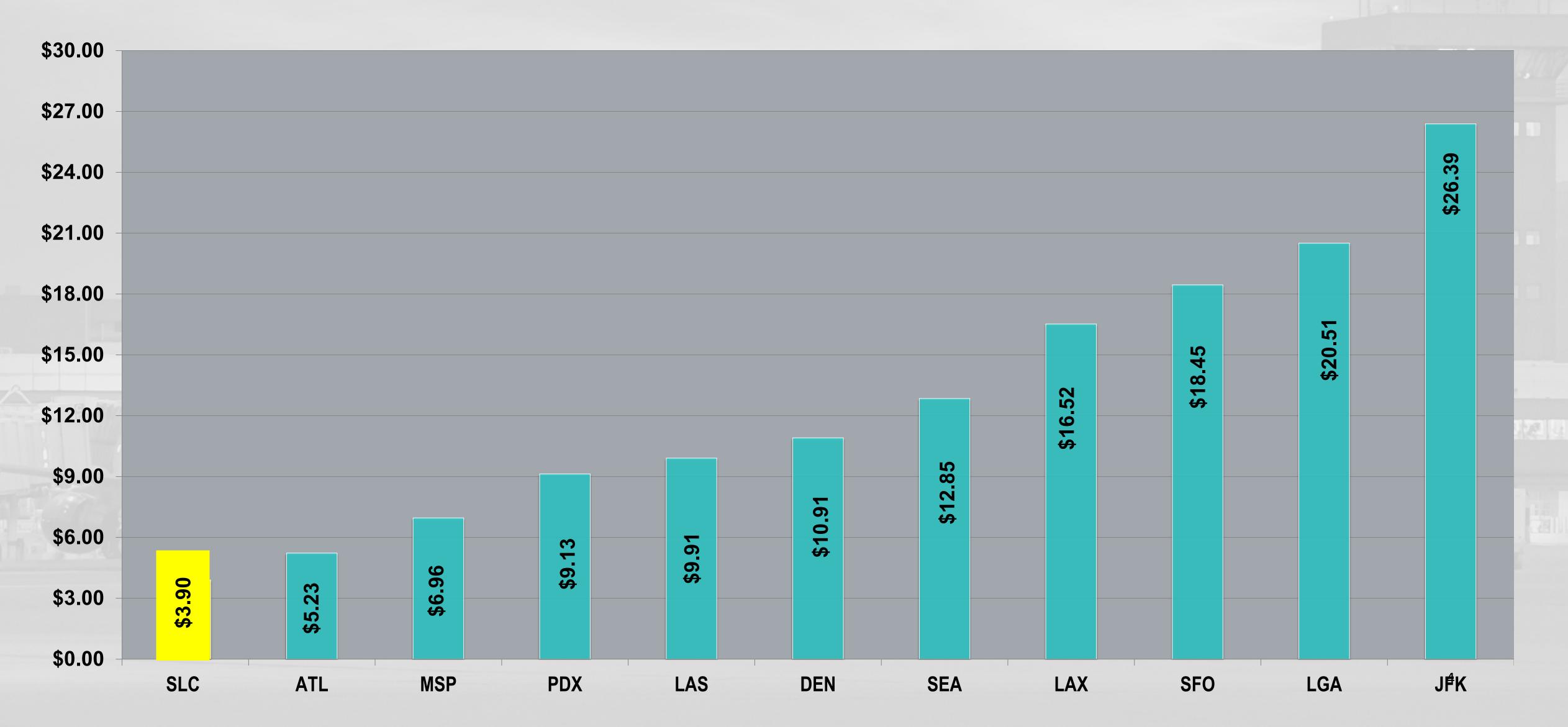

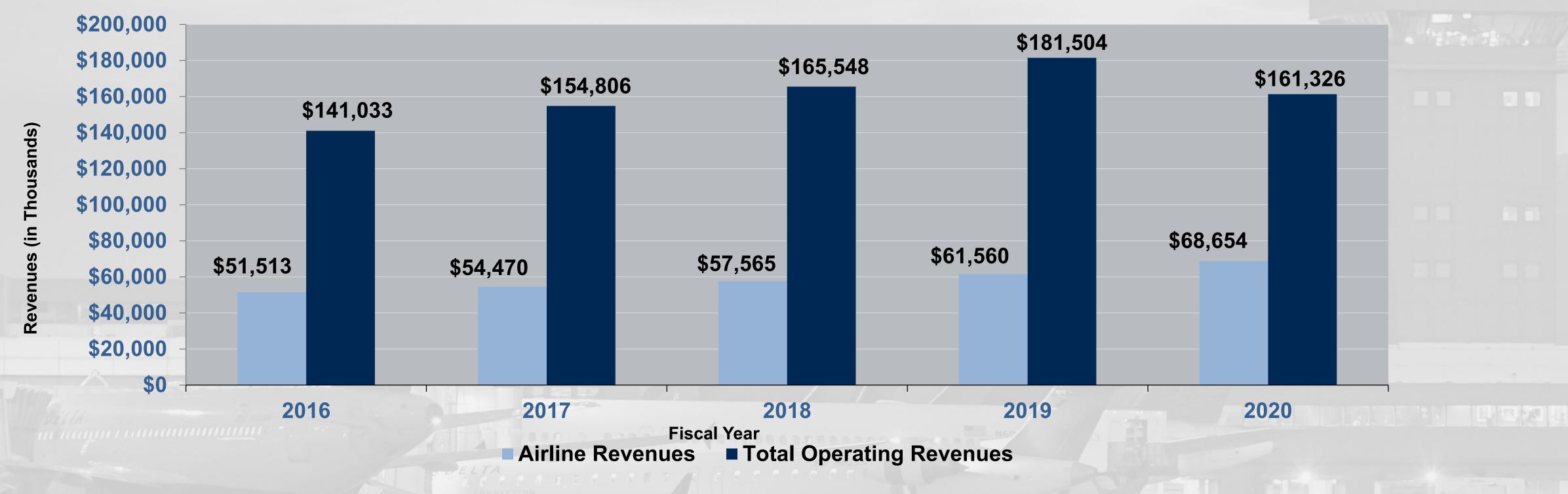

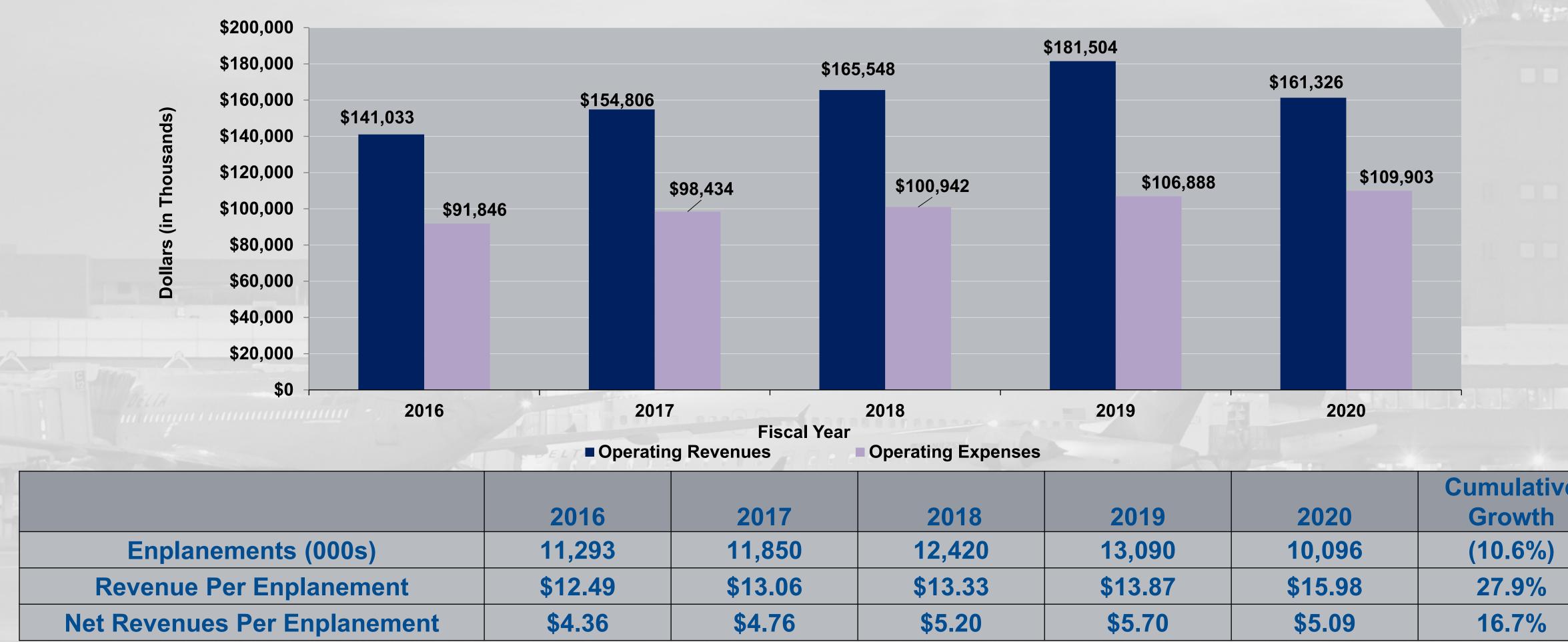

DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION REPORT

CONSTRUCTION

- (1) **Central Screening Warehouse** The Contractor has finished up minor punch list items for the Central Screening Warehouse. Construction has been completed for the building tenant, Bradford Logistics with the exception of one punch list item concerning the back-up generator. Final completion is anticipated for October 30, 2020.
- (2) **Taxiway K Pavement Rehabilitation** This project is nearing completion. Additional work remaining includes work on the storm drain line located near the south ramp of the Air National Guard / K5 innertaxi lane that was added to the contract to address a ponding problem in the area. Minor delays have happened due to Covid issues. It is anticipated all work will be completed by the end of October 2020.
- (3) Airfield Lighting Wiring Phase 4 The Contractor, Royal Electric Company has completed approximately 95% of the work for this project. Substantial completion is anticipated for October 20, 2020.
- (4) **Pump House No. 1 Reconstruction** The Contractor is currently completing modifications to the wet well in preparation for the new pumps to be installed. The control system for the new pumps is being installed in anticipation of the arrival of the pumps.
- (5) **Taxiway E Reconstruction** The Contractor is currently paving the second and final phase of the project and is expected to finish by the end of October 2020.
- (6) **Relocate Gate 10 & 11** The Contractor has completed the gate equipment and card reader installation for Gate 10. The electrical panels are expected to arrive on October 23, 2020. The underground electrical work is proceeding on Gate 11. The guard shack roofing has begun. The new security fence on the north east side of the Post Office will be completed by the end of this week. Concrete islands around the guard shack are currently taking place. Substantial completion for Gate 10 and Gate 11 is anticipated for November 9, 2020.
- (7) **Parking Lot E (South)** The emergency access gate construction has started. Concrete curb and gutter is scheduled for this week. The remaining sidewalk will be completed by the end of October 2020. Landscaping along the south edge of the parking lot is in progress.
- (8) **Parking Lot E Pedestrian Canopy** The final concrete piers for the south half of the canopy have been placed. Structural steel is on-site for the south half and the columns are being erected. Purlins and roof deck have been installed on the north half of the canopy.
- (9) **Airport Operations Center Canopy -** The Contractor has completed all of the concrete footings for the canopy structure. The fabricated steel for the canopy has been delivered to the site and erection of the south end lower canopy has started.
- (10) **Quick Turn Around (QTA) Deck Coating** The Contractor, Paulsen Construction has completed approximately 50% of the deck coating. Work on the expansion joints and pour back strips has started.
- (11) **Glycol Plant and Wildlife Services Office Building -** The Contractor has started the foundation and footing work. Rough-in utility work is on-going. Submittal review and approval for the project is continuing.
