DOWNTOWN VISITATION

While hybrid work is keeping office occupancy rates below 2019 levels, an ongoing geolocation study of the U.S. and Canada shows that overall visitation to Salt Lake's city center is up 139% from prepandemic levels, the highest of the 62 cities analyzed.

UNEMPLOYMENT

Utah's unemployment rate dropped back down to 2.3% in April, remaining one of the lowest in the nation. Additionally, Utah's labor force participation rate reached its highest levels since 2019 in March and April at 69%, more than any state in the U.S.

HOME SALE PRICES TICK UPWARD

Despite ongoing increases in interest rates, Utah's median home sale prices have risen again following months of decline from a peak in May 2022. Demand for housing in Utah remains robust due to remarkable population growth, especially in the Salt Lake City area.

FILM INDUSTRY GROWTH

Utah's film industry continues to grow at an impressive pace, with several large projects in the works, and an estimated economic impact of \$135M. Perhaps the most notable project is Kevin Costner's "Horizon, an American Saga," which will contribute \$90M to the state's economy alone.

FERTILITY & HOUSEHOLD SIZE

Though fertility rates have steadily drop globally, including in Utah, the state continues to have the nation's largest household size, with one in five households having five or more residents, or **20.4%.** Utah also continues to be the youngest state in the nation, with the median age of 31.3.

INTERNATIONAL PASSENGER GROWTH

SLC Airport is back to growth mode, with year-todate passenger traffic outpacing 2019 levels by 2%. Even more impressive, international traffic growth far exceeds that of domestic, with an increase of 32%, or 102K passengers, for the same period.
