SLC's New Terminal Will Offer More Convenience to Travelers

One of the things our passengers appreciate most about Salt Lake City International Airport is its convenience. Whether it's a local, a connecting passenger, or a visitor, SLC continues to receive high marks for the ease-of-use of our facility. While SLC's new terminal will be more modern, sustainable, and efficient, we are proud to say that convenience will still be our top priority.

A great deal of thought has gone into the design of the new terminal to make it as convenient as possible for our passengers. For example, the baggage claim area will be on the same level as the parking garage, rather than one floor below the skybridges as it is today. This approach in design eliminates the need for travelers to haul their luggage up an escalator or elevator to access the parking garage.

Another element that is important to our visitors is the convenience of the rental car facilities. In the new terminal, passengers will still be a short walk from the rental car counters as they are today, rather than traveling to remote facilities. The "Gateway Center" between the terminal and new parking garage will include 10 car rental brands and other ground transportation options.

Locating rental car counters close to the terminal means that visitors can be on their way to ski resorts, downtown hotels, Southern Utah's national parks, or wherever else they're headed, within minutes of collecting their bags. Like today, this

convenience helps give guests to Utah a favorable first impression.

Salt Lake City International Airport is fortunate to have ample land on which to build a new terminal and related facilities so there is no need to move functions, like rental car operations, off airport property. This is a significant issue for many airports, which are land-constrained and are forced to create off-site facilities.

The first major phase of SLC's Terminal Redevelopment Program currently under construction is the rental car Quick Turn-Around (QTA) facility and related Rental Service Sites (RSS). These buildings are being built southwest of the current parking garage in what used to be the northern long-term parking area. The QTA is where rental cars are cleaned and fueled before being moved to the parking garage to be picked up by visitors. The RSS facilities are where more heavy duty maintenance takes place.

The QTA/RSS buildings will be complete in March 2016, after which their old counterparts will be demolished.
