SVRA | Successful Spring Airport Hangar Inspections

The South Valley Regional Airport team recently concluded spring hangar inspections, which is a critical component to ensure the safety and compliance of airport's aviation facilities. The inspections are as a proactive measure to ensure that hangars are safe, compliant and ready for occupancy.

Key Inspection Outcomes

Lease Compliance: Inspectors verified that all hangars met lease standards--including the proper storage of hazardous materials--and were occupied by aircraft as specified in the airport's lease agreements.

Safety Measures: Inspectors checked each hangar's fire extinguishers for valid inspection stickers and ensured that properly-sized electrical cords were being used. Both are crucial for preventing accidents and to ensure readiness in the event of an emergency.

Tenants are also encouraged to verify that hangars are secured with an airport-issued lock to safeguard aircraft and equipment from unauthorized access. Locks are also required in the airport lease agreement.

Maintenance Standards: The overall condition and maintenance of the hangars was also reviewed to ensure the facility is in good repair and free from any structural issues.

Insurance Coverage: Leases with the airport require a current certificate of insurance be submitted each year. To submit a current certificate of insurance, email hangarinsurance@slcgov.com

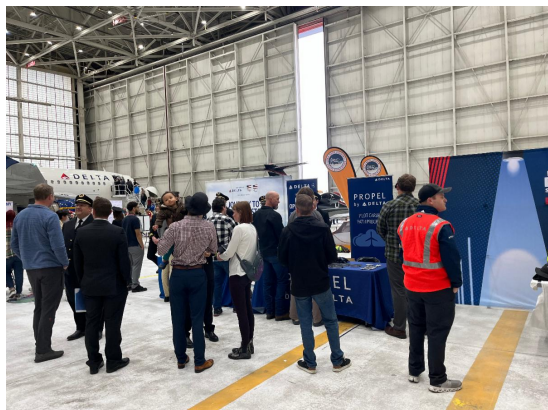
Interactive and Educational Experience
