SLC International Airport Recognizes Volunteers During National Volunteer Week, April 7 through 13

Salt Lake City, UT– Salt Lake City International Airport (SLC) recently launched an Airport Ambassadors Volunteer Program to assist passengers while traveling through the airport. SLC will be recognizing these volunteers Thursday, April 11 at a luncheon as part of National Volunteer Week, April 7 through 13, 2019.

Airport Ambassadors assist passengers in a number of ways. They direct passengers to their gates or baggage claim area, answer questions about ground transportation, report security violations or medical emergencies, and answer questions about restaurant and shopping options.

With the new airport coming online in fall of 2020, more volunteers are needed to assist passengers navigate the new facility. Those interested in volunteering are asked to commit to at least one, four-hour shift per week and are required to pass a background check. Volunteers will be given an Airport Ambassadors shirt and jacket and will be reimbursed for parking during their shift.
